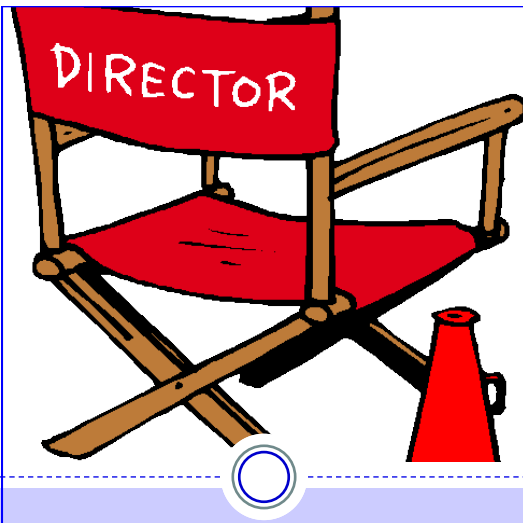

The **Young Indies Short Film Competition** returns to Aberfeldy with some new events !

FILM MAKING

Two **free workshops** in Aberfeldy for children and young people to create their own films and learn the skills from experienced film makers Jim Stirk (Animation for Juniors) and Kate Burton (Film Making for Seniors).

Schools, youth groups and young people are invited to submit short films of any length up to 10 minutes, theme and style of their choice, for the Young Indies **Short Film Competition**. There are 2 categories Junior and Senior, 6 films shortlisted in each, winners will be announced on 18 November. See your films on the big screen at the **free schools screenings** at The Birks Cinema on 12th& 13th November. All films, whether entering the competition or not, must be registered with HFS by **28 September**, accompanied by a registration fee of **£5 per film**.

Young Indies Logo Competition

Heartland Film Society is inviting pupils from primary schools across Highland Perthshire to design a logo for the Young Indies short film competition and related events. The winning logo should be in digital format (jpg file) and will be used on Facebook, website and paper publicity. Closing date for entries 26 October. The winner will be announced during Aberfeldy Film Festival week (12 to 18 November) A brief is available from Heartland film Society.

Meet the Young Filmmaker Events

Once again HFS are inviting young film makers and young people involved in the film industry from Scotland to screen their short films and to talk to young audiences in Highland Perthshire. They'll talk about their work and their experiences, for example film making, videos and documentary work, writing for film, film reviewing, how they got into film and what inspires them.

Seeing what other young people have achieved in film and hearing their stories inspires children and young people to think about how they can acquire skills and knowledge, and become involved.

These events will take place during the week of Aberfeldy Film Festival, and dates will be confirmed in early October.

What's Young Indies about?

Young Indies are Young Independent Film Makers. Heartland Film Society aims to encourage children and young people in Highland Perthshire to develop an interest in films and film making. Making a short film can form part of all kinds of projects:

- * literacy
- * family
- * science
- * activities week
- * child support
- * transition,
- * theme weeks
- * holiday trips

Making a film as a group helps with team building, confidence building and creating a sense of community.

Young Indies learn a multitude of skills: organizing, negotiating, dealing with conflict, managing, writing, costume making, prop making, researching, and film editing.
